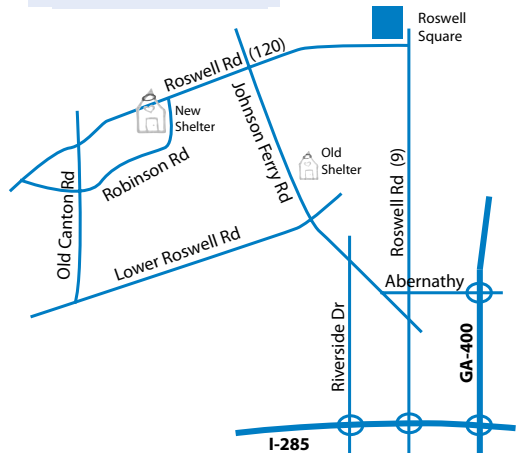

Dear Friends,

This past year brought a multitude of success to Good Mews. With the first full year in our new shelter now behind us, we can look back on some of 2016's most exciting highlights.

In 2016 we were able to save the lives of 478 cats and kittens. We found loving, forever homes for 428 of our cats, a record for Good Mews since moving to East Cobb in 2003. We started cat yoga classes – the newest sensation in the metro Atlanta area – and we were even profiled by CNN, which led to our story going viral. Thanks to your donations, we raised over \$17,000 on Georgia Gives Day, more than doubling what we raised in 2015! Finally, we participated in the first ever Best Friends “Strut your Mut” Atlanta event. Surprisingly, Good Mews, a cat shelter, even won the award for top fundraising organization in the area!

With such incredible achievements behind us, sometimes it's hard to imagine what 2017 will look like for Good Mews. But I can assure you, this year

will bring us new opportunities for triumphs as well as our share of challenges to overcome. The important thing to remember is that Good Mews, now going into its 29th year of service, is built on a strong backbone of dedicated supporters like YOU.

So, how many cats can Good Mews help in 2017? 479? More?? That number, in part, depends on you. # Operation: Complete the Suite

Good Mews is very excited to be launching the “Operation: Complete the Suite” campaign! Now that Good Mews has settled into its beautiful, permanent home, plans are underway to build out and equip the Misty Williamson Surgical Suite. Some of you already know that Dale Williamson sponsored the surgical suite during the initial Capital Campaign in honor of his family’s beloved cat, Misty.



Good Mews is also extremely fortunate to have received a generous gift from The Fisher Family, to be used towards furnishing the suite. Now, here is where you come in! The Fisher Family’s generosity presents an exciting opportunity for Good Mews volunteers and supporters to make a gift, which will in turn be matched up to a maximum total amount. So far, we have already raised over \$200,000 towards the surgical suite!

The overall goal of the “Operation: Complete the Suite” campaign is to raise \$500,000. This campaign will provide the funds needed to do all of the required construction, purchase equipment and supplies, and create a reserve fund for operating the surgical suite. The Board of Directors plan to use a contract veterinarian at first, then hire a staff vet as more services are added.

## Operation: Complete the Suite

will occur in 4 phases:

### Phase 1

Phase 1 will enable our participating veterinarians and/or a contract veterinarian to provide general medical care and perform spay/neuter surgeries on Good Mews cats and kittens. This is such a positive step because providing on-site spay/neuters, and eventually other procedures to the resident cats, will be less stressful for them. The kitties will be able to recuperate from surgery at Good Mews and receive care from the staff and volunteers they have come to recognize as their caregivers.

### Phase 2

As part of Phase 2, low cost spay/neuter services will be offered for animals currently in the program of other local rescue groups.

### Phase 3

This phase will consist of adding equipment and resources to enable our veterinarians to take on-site dental x-rays and to perform dental cleanings and do tooth extractions.

### Phase 4

The final phase will consist of introducing a low cost spay/neuter clinic that will be open to the community.

Don't be fooled by her initial resistance; La Tigra is just tired of being surrounded by cats and desperately wants some personal time. Zoe came to Good Mews in 2008 from an Animal Control facility when she was only two months old. An adorable kitten, she was adopted quickly. Zoe's second sojourn at Good Mews lasted only a month, then her second family adopted her. Unfortunately, she lasted only three months in her new home. It was apparent from her previous experiences that Zoe was sensitive to changes in her environment, and was not comfortable in a tumultuous setting. Her care-givers at Good Mews quickly came to understand and love Zoe's unique character, personality, and needs. The trait that quickly captured the attention of everyone around her was her uncanny ability to figure out how to open any door, which she did, in order to make her rounds to the staff of Good Mews. She would often be found sitting

HALO cats are typically overlooked for adoption because of age, ongoing medical conditions, or behavioral issues – the most common reasons behind euthanasia at traditional animal shelters. Funds designated to this program help pay for the ongoing medical care of these cats while they wait for AND once they find their perfect home.

### CATmitment Program

*Opening your heart and our doors!*

The best way to sustain operations and ensure Good Mews is able to grow is by having a predictable monthly income. You can help the cats and kittens on a monthly basis through a recurring donation of \$50, \$25, \$20, \$15, \$10, or other amount. Funds from the monthly CATmitment Program will go toward the care of the cats and kittens, as well as toward renovation of the new shelter building.
